



Pack 99 Overview

- For boys and girls Kindergarten-5th
- 2 family campouts per year, Pinewood Derby, Blue & Gold Banquet, service projects and more
- Year-round programming
- Journey to Excellence "Gold" level many years in a row
 - Must meet at least 8 out of 11 objectives in categories: Planning & Budget, Membership, Program, Volunteer Leadership
 - Gold is the highest level and means "exceptional"
- Successful track record of transitioning Cub Scouts to Scouts BSA

What do Scouts do in Den meetings?




- Scouts do fun activities called "adventures"

2023-24 Dues
